The participants.

Work sector, setting and location.

There were 11 participants for this training.

All participants were largely from the AOD sector (n=10), however one did specify mental health also. One participant did not mention their sector.

Participants were largely from community (n=4) and rehab (n=2) settings, with equal participants (n=1) from the medical and drug court settings, as well as the clinical and community service settings. One participant did not answer this question.

Occupations consisted of AOD worker (n=6), counsellor (n=3) and social worker (n=1), with one participant not answering this question.

Postcodes indicated there were 2 participants were from both the Geelong CBD area (3220) and the Hobart area (7008), plus 1 participant from Mansfield (3722), St Kilda (3182), Bendigo (3550,) Melbourne CBD (3000) and Box Hill (3128). Two participants did not answer this question.

Diversity.

One of the participants identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander. Also, two different participants identified as coming from a culturally or linguistically diverse background.



Participant feedback.

Knowledge, skills, confidence and relevance.

There was an increase in knowledge, skills and confidence from before to after training. Average participant knowledge scores increased from 3.7 (out of 8) before training to 6.0 after training; skills ratings increased from 3.5 to 5.1; and confidence scores increased from 3.5 to 5.1.

Self-assessments of relevance were only conducted after training (average 7.4 out of 8 after)

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Satisfaction.

Participants were very satisfied with the training. The average satisfaction rating was 9.2, with a median of 9 (out of 10). When asked how likely they would be to recommend training, scores were on average 9.4 (out of 10), with a median of 10.
